David Attenborough's Zoo Quest In Colour 9pm and 2am, BBC4

Zoo Quest was the BBC's first filmed natural history programme, and in the mid-Fifties it made the name of a young broadcaster, Attenborough (this was a time when BBC chaps were known by their surnames). The rather dingy black-and-white footage didn't really stand up to modern scrutiny – until now, after some extraordinarily vibrant and evocative 16mm colour film was discovered, covering a dashing young Attenborough (*left*) and cameraman Charles Lagus's early trips to Africa and South America. They both recall making it up as they went along and inventing a genre that was to go on to be the backbone of the BBC schedules.

EastEnders 7.25pm, BBC1

Grant Mitchell returns to Albert Square for the first time in 10 years, Ross Kemp safe in the knowledge that he has since become an internationally renowned television presenter and won't be seen to be slinking back for lack of other offers. Obsessive Compulsive Country House Cleaners 8pm, Channel 4

Old School With The Hairy Bikers 9pm, BBC2
